This week, the whole school has been involved in a range of activities for Anti-Bullying Week. We began with Odd Socks Day, where children and staff wore colourful, mismatched socks to celebrate individuality and remind us that it's okay to be different. Throughout the week, classes have been taking part in discussions, role play, creative tasks and circle-time activities focused on friendship, respect and kindness. We are looking forward to celebrating the week with an Anti-Bullying Assembly next Wednesday. Every year group has prepared either a poem or a song that reflects the theme 'Power For Good'.

Thank you to everyone who attended Parents' Evening. These meetings are a vital part of strengthening the partnership between home and school, and they give you the chance to discuss achievements, progress and next steps with your child's class teacher. Your engagement plays a huge role in supporting your child's learning journey, and we truly appreciate the time you took to attend.

Today and Monday, all classes from Year 1 to Year 6 will be taking part in interactive workshops delivered by Chester Zoo. These sessions focus on the impact of palm oil production on rainforests and endangered wildlife. The workshops help our children understand how everyday choices can influence conservation efforts around the world. Pupils will explore sustainable alternatives, learn how palm oil plantations affect habitats, and think about how they can help protect endangered animals. This links closely with our curriculum work on global citizenship, responsible choices and environmental awareness, and we're excited to see the children engage with such an important topic.
